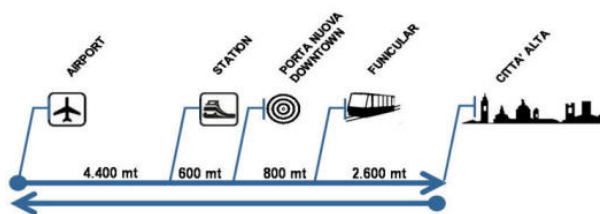

Directions

From Bergamo Orio al Serio-Caravaggio (BGY) Airport:

Taxi: taxis are available just out of the airport arrivals area. From the airport into Bergamo, it costs approximately € 20.00 and it takes 10 minutes.

Local bus service: ATB 3-zone tickets (€ 2.10) are available at the airport news-stands. [Bus number 1](#) operates from Orio al Serio airport and calls at Bergamo Railway Station, Porta Nuova (Downtown), Cable car (Funicolare) station, Upper Town (Colle Aperto).



From Milano Malpensa (MPX) Airport:

i) By bus to Milano Centrale: “Malpensa Express” or “Malpensa Shuttle Air Pullman”, from Terminal 1; also calls at Terminal 2 (ca 50 mins, € 10).

Trains run every hour all day from Milano Centrale to Bergamo. Tickets can be bought at the Railway station (ca 1 h, € 5.30).

ii) By taxi: from Malpensa to Bergamo: ca 1 h, 155 €

From Linate (I-LNT) Airport:

i) By bus to Milano Centrale: “Autostradale”, (ca 20 mins, € 5).

Trains run every hour all day from Milano Centrale to Bergamo. Tickets can be bought at the Railway station (ca 1 h, € 5.30).

ii) By taxi: from Linate to Bergamo: ca 40 min, 90 €

Other information:

Using local buses: a ticket (city zone) costs € 1.25 and, once validated, it lasts 75 minutes.
